Personal matters.

Gerald Joseph Boucher was born on August 31, 1923, in Campbellton, New Brunswick. He was not married and lived with his parents at Campbellton, 9 Gerrard Street.

He was the son of Sylva John Boucher and Olive Furlotte, who were married on August 28, 1918, in Atholville, New Brunswick. His father was born in the USA, Providence, Rhode Island. His father's profession was crane operator. He had 1 younger sister Veronica who was also not married and lived with her parents. In 1934 he left Campbellton Public School at the age of 13, then Campbellton High School for another 6 years until 1940. He reached the Grade 9 level. Before joining the service in 1942 he worked for 2 years as a car inspector on the Canadian National Road in Campbellton. His hobbies were hunting and fishing. He was an excellent skier, he also occasionally participated in swimming and American football.

Military Affairs.

He was enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in Moncton, New Brunswick on 29 July 1942. He received his training and education successively until 9 October 1942 in Lachine, Quebec until 9 January 1943 in Rockcliffe, Ontario until 16 April 1943 in Mont Joli, Quebec then via Halifax, Nova Scotia on 3 May 1943 to Great Britain.

He was killed on 25 April 1944 when his plane was shot down during a bombing raid on Karlsruhe, Germany, and crashed in the Eastern Scheldt northeast of Krabbendijke, Zeeland. He is temporarily buried in the German cemetery in Bergen op Zoom, MR 627277, SH15, S.E. 1/25,000 GSGS 4427. He was reburied on 28 September 1945 at the Canadian War Cemetery in Bergen op Zoom, Plot 12, row F, grave 07.

Details.

- On his tombstone is written: "In loving memory of our only son, mum and dad" which means: "in loving memory of our only son, mum and dad".
- He has received: 39-45 Star, Defence Medal Star, General Service Medal, Operational Wings, and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp.
- Total earnings in 1 year and 7 months of active service are not known.
- According to the CWGC, Gerald Jseph Boucher was 19 years old when he died. That's NOT right, that should be 20 years.

 - Gerald's aircraft (Handley Page, Halifax, MK III, MZ573, KW-G, RCAF 425 Sqdn) took off at Tholthorpe, Yorkshire, England on 24 April 1944 during a bombing raid on Karlsruhe. It did not return from this mission, because it was shot down at 02.30 hours on 25 April 1944 by a German night fighter and crashed in the Oosterschelde about 5 km northeast of Krabbendijke.
